In April 1521, tragedy struck as Magellan was killed in the Philippines during a skirmish with indigenous people. Despite the loss of their captain, the crew resolved to complete the voyage. Under the leadership of Juan Sebastián Elcano, the expedition pressed on. The remaining ship, the Victoria, returned to Spain in September 1522, marking the successful circumnavigation of the Earth.
